



Bill underline the importance of family. He said that failure as a father and a husband is far worse than failure as a City Manager. Jerry did a marvelous job of following Bill's emotional presentation. He said that it is important to respect those you work with. Cynthia said that an overly-controlling manager is as bad for an organization that a micromanaging City Council.

Stockton Deputy City Manager Mike Locke, 69, will retire at the end of May ending a local government career that spans 5 decades. Mike is a former <u>Tracy</u> City Manager. Rosemead Director of Community Development Michelle Ramirez no longer is "acting." She is the real deal these days. Anaheim Interim City Manager **Bob** Wingerroth is among the five finalists being interviewed for the Anaheim City Manager appointment. New Orland City Manager Pete Carr will serve his last day as the Biggs City Manager on May 23, and be in his new Orland City Hall office the following morning.
