

## City Managers Serving in Rural County Cities

#### Rural County Representatives of California (RCRC)

As the League of California Cities does for its member cities, RCRC works with its member counties to advocate on behalf of rural issues at the State and federal levels. RCRC provides the rural county perspective on issues such as land use, water and natural resources, housing, transportation, wildfire protection policies, and health and human services, among other subjects. The core RCRC mission is to improve the ability of small, rural California county governments to provide services by reducing the burden of State and federal mandates and to promote a greater understanding of rural county issues and the unique challenges that face California's small population counties.

RCRC President and CEO Greg Norton was appointed to the organization's top management post in June, 2006. He joined the RCRC staff in 2000. Greg earned a BA in Business Administration and Accounting from Harding University. He also completed the Executive Program in Leadership Excellence at the University of California, Davis. Greg served in various local government management positions for more than 14-years prior to joining the RCRC staff. He has several years of auditor experience.

Patricia J. Megason is the RCRC Executive Vice President. She joined the RCRC staff in 2002 as the Vice President of Governmental Affairs. Patricia is responsible for the day-to-day operations of RCRC and manages the governmental relations functions, including legislative and regulatory affairs at both the State and federal levels of aovernment. Prior to coming on board with RCRC Patricia was a founding member and Managing Director of a Sacramento legal and consulting firm. She served as the Director of California State Parks from 1997 to 1999, and prior to that was the Chief Deputy Director for Legislative Affairs for State Parks. Before working for State Parks, Patricia was a senior consultant for the California State Legislature for a decade. She served as a consultant to the Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee. Patricia earned a BA in Government from California State University, Sacramento.

In this issue the list includes city manager from cities in the counties from Alpine to Mono.

There are no incorporated cities or towns in Alpine County. In Amador County the incorporated cities include: Amador City, Ione, Jackson, Plymouth and Sutter Creek. Jackson and Sutter Creek are listed in the ICMA Who's Who.



**Michael S. Daly** began his municipal government career in <u>Manhattan Beach</u> in 1983 as an Administrative Aide. In 1984 Mike was promoted to

Administrative Analyst, and he was named to the <u>Manhattan Beach</u> Administrative Services Manager post in 1991. In 1994 Mike was promoted to Administrative Services Director. 

Between 1990 and 1993 Gene served the City of Folsom as an Associate and Assistant Planner. He joined the Riverbank staff in 1993 as the Director of Planning, Building & Economic Development. ## City Managers Serving in Rural County Cities

El Dorado County's <u>Placerville</u> and <u>South Lake</u> Tahoe are not listed, and Glenn County's <u>Willows</u> is not listed either. However, <u>Orland</u> City Manager **Peter R. Carr** is listed.

Peter R. Carr, 53, served in the United States Air Force from 1986 to 1990, and was a Captain when he left the service in Washington. He went to work in private industry with General Mills, International Paper Company and TFI Benchmark from 1990 to 2006. Pete was appointed City Administrator in Biaas, California in 2007, and after serving in that post for some five-years he was selected to serve as the Orland City Manager starting in 2012. Orland is the most populous city in Glenn County with a 2010 Census population of 7,291. Pete earned a BA in business administration from California State University, Sacramento. Pete has volunteered as a coach and adviser for the Boy Scouts and youth baseball teams.

Alturas in Modoc County is not on the ICMA list, but Mammoth Lakes on Mono County is there. David G. Wilbrecht, 41, is currently serving as the Town Manager in Mammoth Lakes, California. David began his public sector career in 1994 after spending about 5-years on the private side starting in 1989. He was appointed Deputy Director of Parks & Recreation for Federal Way, Washington. In 2000 David moved south to California to become the Director of Parks & Recreation for the Town of Mammoth Lakes. In 2003 David was selected to serve as the Chief Administrative Officer in Mono County. He served in this Chief Appointed Administrative Officer post for about 8-years. In 2011 David was selected to serve as the Mammoth Lakes Town Manager. He earned a BA from Central Washington University and an MPA from Seattle University. In 2010 David received a 10-year ICMA Service Award. He has served as the Chair to the Mammoth Lakes Trail System Coordinating Committee.

**Picking Up the Pieces:** <u>Colton</u> City Manager **Rod Foster** has been appointed to replace retired <u>Laguna Niguel</u> City Manager **Tim Casey**. Rod will start his new position in

March. With Palos Verdes Estates City Manager Judy Smith's last day in office February 22, former Palos Verdes Estate Chief of Police Dan Dreiling has agreed to serve as Interim City Manager until May 15 or when a city manager is hired to replace him. It is reported that Judy and her husband Martin Smith, an editor with Orange Coast Magazine, are relocating to Orange County. Paul Cayler, 47, the former City Manager in Willits, has been appointed Interim City Manager in Cloverdale. Filling in behind the resignation of City Manager Nina Regor, who is the new City Administrator in Camas, Washington. Thousand Oaks Assistant City Manager Mark Watkins, 51, has been selected to be the new Ventura City Manager replacing Interim City Manager Johnny Johnston. Johnny has held the position since last September following the resignation of eight-year City Manager Rick Cole. Bob Murray & Associates provided executive recruiting services for the Ventura selection process. Mark worked for Ventura between 1987 and 2001, first as a Civil Engineer and then as the Maintenance Services Manager. He joined the Thousand Oaks staff as the Deputy Public Works Director. Retired veteran City Manager Kevin O'Rourke, a Senior Consultant with Public Alternative Retirement System (PARS), has been appointed to serve as the Interim City Manager in Santa Ana. Kevin has been City Manager in Stanton, Buena Park and Fairfield, and he has served as Interim City Manager in Stockton and Woodland. He is a Past President of the City Managers' Department of the League of California Cities, and a former West Coast Regional Vice President on the International Citv/Countv Management Association (ICMA) Executive Board. Kevin is also a past member of the California City Management Foundation Board of Trustees, and he is a member of the Cal-ICMA Board. Phil Green, retired Chief of Police in Corte Madera and Larkspur, died on Sunday, February 10, 2013, while visiting family in Southern California. He was 72. Chief Green retired as the Chief of the "Twin Cities" police force in 2010. He lived in Novato. At the time of his retirement he was the longest serving police chief in California. He began his law enforcement career with the San Rafael Police Department in 1961.





Albany City Manager Beth Pollard is exploring options for fulfilling the duties of the Fire Chief following the Piedmont decision to stop sharing its Chief with Albany. Fire Chief Edward Tubbs served both cities, but plans to retire May 31. Piedmont City Administrator Geoffrey Grote recommended that the shared chief arrangement be discontinued indicating that **Piedmont** does not have sufficient administrative staff to continue with a half-time chief. Arne Croce, retired San Mateo City Manager and more recently the Interim Chief Administrative Officer in Bell, is the new Executive Director of Peninsula Family Service in San Mateo. Peninsula Family Service offers programs in child development and education; support of healthy family interaction; parent education and coaching; wellness and lifelong learning for older adults; and financial empowerment. Novato City Manager Michael Frank recently delivered a State of the City address and reported that retail sales and incomes are on the rise, hotel vacancies are down and small businesses are opening at an increasing rate. He noted that there is an impending construction of an In-N-Out Burger planned for the Vintage Oaks Shopping Center, among other developments. Businesses in Novato are opening at an increased pace. Firebaugh City Manager Laura Weyant has submitted her resignation, and Finance Director Pio Martin has been appointed Acting City Manager. Firebaugh's financial struggles include a projected \$1.2 million general fund deficit. Tustin Deputy City Manager Chuck Robinson worked in the Laguna Beach Public Works Department from 1999 to 2002. He earned a BA in Communications for California State University, Fullerton and an MPA from the University of La Verne. With Campbell City Manager Amy Brown taking the Santa Clara County Director of Agriculture and Environmental Management post, the new Campbell City Manager will be Cupertino Director of Parks and Recreation Mark Linder. Mark held various position with San Jose, including Deputy City Manager, between 1995 and 2008 when he joined the Cupertino staff. Previous to that he served as Assistant Town Manager in Los Gatos and Assistant General Manager with the Santa Cruz Metropolitan Transit District, Mark earned a BA from Macalester College and an MPA from San Jose State University. San Rafael Assistant City Manager Jim Schutz, 44, was recognized as the recipient of the 2013 John H. Nail Memorial Award during the annual meeting of the City Managers Department of the League of California Cities in San Francisco. The award recognizes the top municipal assistant. Jim became the San Rafael ACM in 2007. La Mirada Public Works Director Steve Forster, a 23-year veteran of the La Mirada city staff, has resigned his position.
