We are starting with recent award winning City Manager, Linda Benedetti-Leal. She has worked for the City of Paramount for more than 25years. The City of Paramount employs 113 full time and a varying number of part-time employees. Morale is good and the city has been able to maintain all of its' programs during the economic downturn that has affected local governments statewide and beyond. Linda talks with pride of the Paramount city staff, and indicates that the city hires happy people who work hard and Paramount has no unions. (Paramount and La Mirada are said to be the only cities in Southern California that have no unions.) Linda came to the city manager position following service as the City's Assistant City Manager working with City Manager Pat West, who is currently the Long Beach City Manager. Linda has many years of city government experience, and she earned a law degree from Yale University. Linda is a 2013 recipient of the prestigious El Gran Matador Award presented by the California Contract Cities Association.

California "Linda" City Managers



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Pomona City Manager Linda C. Lowry began her public service career on the staff of Josephine County, Oregon. Once she returned to California, Linda

became the Bellflower Assistant Finance Director in May, 1987. She was promoted first to Finance Director and then Assistant City Administrator, and in April, 1993 she was selected to serve as Acting City Administrator. Linda was appointed Bellflower's Chief Administrative Officer in August, 1993. She left Bellflower in June, 1997 and took on a number of special assignments, including work with the Gateway Cities COG and the City of South Gate with then-City Manager Andy Pasmant. In November, 2001 Linda was recruited to serve as the Diamond Bar City Manager where she served for nearly five-years before she was selected to be the Pomona Assistant City Manager working with then-City Manager Doug Dunlap. When Doug retired Linda served for a time as the Interim City Manager and was appointed City Manager in 2008. She has a BA from the University of California and a BS from California State University. While working in Bellflower she earned her CPA. In 2012 Linda was the recipient of a 25-year ICMA Service Award.





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Linda M. Barton began her public management career as a Management Analyst for the Department of Commerce in Colorado in 1974. In 1975 Linda took an Administrative Assistant position with the City of Lakewood, Colorado and she was promoted to Assistant to the City Manager in 1978. Linda moved in Corvallis, Oregon in 1980 to take the Deputy City Manager post where she served for about 5vears. In 1985 Linda was appointed City Manager in Burnsville, Minnesota. She took a position with the State of Minnesota in 1991 as the Commissioner for the Department of Employee Relations. In 1994 Linda was appointed City Manager in Bedford, Texas, and she served there until 1997 when she took the Deputy City Manager job in Bellevue, Washington. It was 2001 when Linda moved to California to become the City Manager in Livermore. She retired from that position in 2011. Linda earned a BA from Colorado College, and an MPA from the University of Colorado. In 2009 she was the recipient of a 30-years ICMA Service Award. Linda has been active with ICMA and continues to serve as a Legacy Leader, and on the Task Force on Women in the Profession. She is a past President of the City Managers Department of the League of California Cities (2010-2011). Linda currently serves as a Senior Advisor for Management Partners, Inc.

Former City Manager Linda Pappas Diaz began her public service career in 1980 as an Administrative Assistant in Downey. In May, 1985 she began serving as a Personnel Assistant in Costa Mesa. In March, 1987 Linda joined the Cerritos staff in an Administrative Assistant position. In May, 1990 Linda was hired to serve as the Assistant to the City Manager in Buena Park where she served for more than 8-years. In August, 1998 Linda was selected to serve as the City Manager in the Town of Colma. She left Colma in 2002 when she was selected to be the Antioch Assistant City Manager/City Manager In May, 2006 Linda in April of that year. returned to Southern California when she was appointed Assistant City Manager in Thousand Oaks and she worked in that post for 3-years. Between 2010 and 2011 Linda took tom consultant/special projects assignments in American Canyon, Stockton and Linda served as a Special Projects Manager and the Interim Deputy Manager-HR Director in Fillmore. In October, 2012 she started her current position as a Retirement Benefits Specialist for the Employees Ventura County Retirement Association. Linda earned a BA from Whittier College. She also completed graduate studies at the Victoria University of Wellington, New Zealand and the University of California, Irvine. Linda was the recipient of a 25-year ICMA Service Award in 2006.

Though the City's web page does not list Linda, we found a 2013 on-line mention that named her as the <u>San Ramon</u> Director of Information Technology. However, the city's web site lists **Rick Maria** as the Information Technology Division Manager, and **Eva Phelps** as the Administrative Services Director for <u>San</u> <u>Ramon</u>. ICMA still lists Linda as a <u>San Ramon</u> Administrative Analyst so we included her here.

An important part of the <u>Palo Alto</u> Executive Team under City Manager **James Keene** is Public Communications Manager **Linda Diane Clerkson**. Prior to joining the <u>Palo Alto</u> staff, Linda worked as a Communications Manager for TIBCO Software Inc. Linda was born in 1960.
