Stanislaus County City Managers

There are nine incorporated cities in Stanislaus County: <u>Ceres</u>, <u>Hughson</u>, <u>Modesto</u>, <u>Newman</u>, <u>Oakdale</u>, <u>Patterson</u>, <u>Riverbank</u>, <u>Turlock</u> and <u>Waterford</u>. **Jody L. Hayes** was appointed Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Stanislaus County in August 2017 following the retirement of **Stan Risen**. The county has a 2019 estimated population of 550,660.





































Ceres incorporated in February 1918 and has an estimated 2020 population of 49,302. Alex **Terrazas** is the <u>Ceres</u> City Manager. He took over as Interim City Manager from former City Manager Tom Westbrook. Alex worked for the Town of <u>Truckee</u> from 2005 to 2012, leaving the town as Assistant to the Town Manager in July 2016. He went to work as the City Manager in Los Banos in Merced County. Previously, Alex worked as a Legislative Intern with Congress Member Vic Fazio, and then went to work as an analyst for the City Manager's Office in Mountain View. He also worked as a member of the staff of the League of California Cities before going to work for Truckee. Alex earned a BA and Master's from California State University. Sacramento.

Hughson incorporated in December 1972. It has a 2020 estimated population of 7,481. Merry Mayhew has served as the <u>Hughson</u> City Manager since June 2020. She previously worked as the Director of Finance and Administrative Services (April 2019-June 2020). Merry worked for Stanislaus County for nearly 35years starting in September 1984. She earned a BA from Western Kentucky University and an MBA in organizational management and human resources from Ashford University.

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
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"Proof of Life"

Modesto, the county seat of Stanislaus County, was incorporated in August 1884. The 2020 estimated population of Modesto is 218,464. Joseph Lopez began his public service career in the personnel department of the County of Sacramento. He joined the Modesto city staff in January 2012 as the Director of Human Resources. He has served as the Modesto City Manager since April 2017. Joe earned a BA in psychology from California State University, Chico, and an MA in industrial and organizational psychology from California State University, Sacramento. He also completed the senior executive program as the Kennedy School at Harvard University.

In the 1850s the Riverbank area was known as Burneyville, and it was known as the site of the Burneyville Ferry over the Stanislaus River. Sean Scully is the Riverbank City Manager, and Marisela H. Garcia is the Assistant City Manager and Director of Finance. Sean was hired as the City of Lincoln City Manager in December 2021. He served as the Riverbank City Manager from 2017, and was previously the City Manager in Gustine. Marisela has taken over as Interim City Manager in Sean's absence.

Turlock incorporated in February 1908. Its 2019 estimated population is 73,631. It is known to some as the "Heart of the Valley," due to the agricultural production in the area. Former Ceres City Manager Toby Wells was appointed Turlock City Manager in March 2020. Toby left Turlock last January to become the City Manager in Manteca. Human Resources Manager Sarah Eddy has been appointed Acting City Manager. Sarah joined the Turlock city staff in 1988. She earned a BA and Master's from California State University, Stanislaus.

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
