Pittsburg is located on the southern shore of the Suisun Bay in the East Bay region of the San Francisco Bay Area. Colonel PITTSBURG Jonathan D. Stevenson laid out

CALIFORNIA the town in 1849 and called it New York of the Pacific. The venture failed by 1850. With the discovery of coal in the nearby town of Nortonvlle, the place became a port of coaling, and adopted the name Black Diamond for the coal mining firm. The town name was changed to Pittsburg in 1909 because the city shared a common steel and mining industrial heritage. The city incorporated in June 1903 as Nortonville and the name change came in 1909. The Pittsburg City Manager is Garrett Evans and the Deputy City Manager is Maria Aliotti. Alice E. **Evenson** is the City Clerk.

Southern Pacific rail service started in 1891 with two stops in the area that became <u>Pleasant Hill</u>. The area did not have a post office until 1948 following World War II. The city incorporated in 1961. It has a 2020 population of 34,613. **June Catalano** is the City Manager and **Danielle Habr** is the City Clerk. **Ericka Mitchell** is the Human Resources & Risk Manager. **Erick Cheung** is the Finance Manager, and the Community Development Director is **Ethan Bindernagel. Bryan Hill** is the <u>Pleasant Hill</u> Chief of Police.

The first post office opened in 1900 and the City of Richmond incorporated in 1905. The 2019 estimated population is 110,567. Shasa Curl is the City Manager and Pamela Christian is the City Clerk. Lina Velasco is the Director of Community Development, and LaShonda White in the Interim Library and Community Services Director. Sharrone Taylor is the Interim Human Resources Director in Richmond, and Angela Walton is the Administrative Services Project Manager.

After initial settlement and modest development, **Hiram Penniman** laid out a town site in 1850. In December 1862 a U.S. Post Office was established under the name "<u>Walnut Creek</u>". Southern Pacific Railroad service arrived in 1891. The city was incorporated in October 1914. The 2020 population is 70.127. The <u>Walnut Creek</u> City Manager is **Dan Buckshi**, and the Assistant City Manager is **Teri Killgore. Suzie Martinez** is the City Clerk. **Kevin Safine** is the Director of Arts and Recreation, and the Chief of Police is **Jamie Knox**.

Dan Buckshi began his working career in the private sector with Honda and Hewlett-Packard. In May 2002 he joined the staff of the County of San Luis Obispo as an Administrative Analyst. He worked his way up in the county organization during a 15-year 4-month tenure. He was appointed County Administrative Officer (CAO) in October 2012.
