Public Managers in Ventura County Cities Revisited



There are ten cities in the County of Ventura including Camarillo, Fillmore, Moorpark, Ojai, Oxnard, Port Hueneme, Santa Paula, Simi Thousand Oaks Valley,

Ventura. We recognized the first five cities in the Special May 2023 issue. This issue features the rest. Ventura County was named for the Mission San Buenaventura and established in March 1872. The county seat is the city of Ventura. Ventura County was officially separated from the County of Santa Barbara in January 1873. The Ventura County Chief Executive Officer is Dr. Sevet Johnson, and the Assistant County Executive Officer is Mike Pettit. Kaye Mand is the County Chief Financial Officer and Shawn Atin is the Director of Human Resources. The 2020 Ventura County estimated population is 843,843.





Port Hueneme is "The Friendly City by the Sea." Juan Rodriguez explored the area and the Channel Islands in 1542. Thomas Bard developed the Hueneme

Wharf in 1871. The existing street grid of Port Hueneme was laid out in 1888. Port Hueneme is the only deepwater port between the Port of Los Angeles and the Port of San Francisco, and the only U.S. Navy controlled harbor between San Diego Bay and Puget Sound, Washington. Port Hueneme was incorporated in March 1948. The estimated 2019 population is 21,926. The Port Hueneme Interim City Manager is Tony Stewart is the Community Development Director and City Planner. Lupe Acero is the Finance Director and City Treasurer, and **Anna Hanely** is the Community Services and Recreation Manager. Gabriela Basua is the Housing and Facilities Maintenance Director. Charles Cable is the City Engineer and Landscape Superintendent.



Interim City Manager **Tony Stewart**, the city planner not the race car driver, began his public service career in June 1995 when he was a Planning Assistant for the City of Artesia. He took a Principal Planner job in <u>Simi Valley</u> in March 1998. He

went to <u>San Bernardino</u> and worked as the Deputy Planning Director before he became the Community Development Director for the City of <u>Galt</u> in March 2014. He worked in <u>Reedley</u> for less than a year in 2016 as Community Development Director. He joined the <u>Port Hueneme</u> staff as Director of Community Development and City Planner in April 2017. Tony was appointed Interim City Manager for <u>Port Hueneme</u> in February 2023. Tony earned a BS and an MS in urban planning from California State Polytechnic University, Pomona.

He is considered the founder of the community where he planted seedling orange trees in 1874. The oil industry also began growing in the area in 1890. Santa Paula was incorporated in April 1902. The 2020 population is set at 30,657. Veteran public manager Dan Singer is the Santa Paula City Manager, and Julie Latshaw is the City Clerk. Christy Ramirez is the Santa Paula Director of Finance and City Treasurer.

<u>Simi Valley</u> is the home of the Ronald Reagan Presidential Library. Former President Reagan was buried there in 2004. The first Europeans to visit Simi

Valley were Spanish explorers in the late 1700s. The earliest American farmer in the area was **Charles Emerson Hoar** as identified by historian Janet Scott Cameron. Locals raised sheep, cattle and grain, and groves of citrus, walnuts and apricots were planted. Residential development started in the late 1950s. The city was incorporated in October 1969. The 2020 population of Simi Valley is put at 126,356. Brian P. Gabler is the City Manager and Lucy Blanco is the City Clerk. Carolyn Johnson is the Administrative Services Director, Stratis Perros is the Environmental Services Director and the Public Works Director is Ron Fuchiwaki.

Powers** is the City Manager, and **Ingrid Hardy** is the Assistant City Manager. **Melissa Hurtado** is the Assistant to the City Manager. **Laura Maguire** is the City Clerk and **Jaime Boscarino** is the Finance Director.

After working as a Program Development & Marketing Specialist for the City of Raleigh, North Carolina (June 1999-July 2002), **Andrew P. Powers** took a position with the City of <u>Ventura</u> as a Marketing & Public Affairs Specialist. <u>Ventura</u> is officially named San Buenaventura. In 1769 a Spanish expedition recorded the first European visitors to the area. Many settlers came to the area following the American Civil War. The original Ventura Pier was built in 1872 and, at the time, was the longest wooden pier in California. It has subsequently been rebuilt following storm damage, especially in 1995. The City of <u>Ventura</u> was incorporated in April 1866. The 2020 population is set at 110,763. **Akbar Alikhan** is the Interim City Manager and **Michael B. MacDonald** is the City Clerk. **Greg Morley** is the Interim Chief Financial Officer, and **Nancy O'Connor** is the Parks & Recreation Director.


