San Mateo County is part of the San Francisco Bay Area, among the nine counties that border the San Francisco Bay. The county came together in 1856 as part of San Francisco County, one of California's 18 original

counties in 1850. The county was officially organized on April 18, 1857. <u>Redwood City</u> is the county seat. The county's 2020 population estimate is 764,442. Alphabetically the second group of cities include <u>East Palo Alto</u>, <u>Foster City</u>, <u>Half Moon Bay</u>, <u>Hillsborough</u>, <u>Menlo Park</u>, <u>Millbrae</u> and <u>Pacifica</u>. **Mike Callagy** is the County Executive Officer and Clerk of the Board. Mike earned a JD from Santa Clara University.

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From the 1850s through the 1940s, the area that became <u>East Palo</u> <u>Alto</u> ranches. <u>East Palo Alto</u> was a farming community with many Japanese resident who were

forced from the area and many were forcibly moved to relocation centers. They did not return after the war. In the 1950s farms were built in the area. <u>East Palo Alto</u> incorporated in July 1983. The 2020 population is set at 30,034. **Melvin E. Gaines** is the City Manager and **James Colin** is the City Clerk. **Marie McKenzie** is the Administrative Services Director and **Azalea Renfield** is the Assistant to the City Manager. The Finance Director is **Tomohito Oku** and **Maurice Baker** is the Acting Community Services Manager. The Chief of Police is **Jeff Liu**.



East Palo Alto City Manager **Melvin** E. Gaines began his public service career in September 2002 working to assess the City of <u>San Jose</u> Youth Commission. After working as a Health Liaison for the County of

Santa Clara (2004-2006) and as a Community Facilitator at Santa Clara University (2004-2006). After a few more positions, including a short time in 2009 as a Policy Analyst for a New Orleans City Council Member, Melvin joined the East Palo Alto city staff as an Administrative Analyst in September 2011. He became a Grants/Special Projects Manager for the East Palo Alto Police Department in May 2012. In 2015 he took a Management Analyst position, and he left the city in November 2016 to take a Principal Management Analyst in the City Manager's Office of the City of Mountain View. Melvin was appointed Assistant Town Manager for the Town of Portola Valley in 2021. He became East Palo Alto City Manager in January 2023. He earned an AA from Foothill College, a BS from Santa Clara University and Masters in urban planning and in public policy from the University of Michigan. Go Blue!

estate entrepreneur who was instrumental in the city's original design. <u>Foster City</u> was incorporated in April 1971. The 2020 population is 33,805. **Stefan Chatwin** is the City Manager and **Priscilla Schaus** is the Communications Director and City Clerk. **Sofia Mangalam** is the Community Development Director and **Derek Schweigart** is the Director of Parks and Recreation. **Julie Paping** is the Administrative Services Director, and the Finance Director is **Edmund Suen**. The Chief of Police is **Tracy Avelar**, and the Public Works Director and City Engineer is **Louis Sun**.



What is now the Town of <u>Hillsborough</u> was part of a land grant purchased in 1846 by <u>William Davis</u> <u>Merry Howard</u>, the son of a shipping magnate of Hillsborough, New Hampshire. The town was incorporated in May 1910. Its 2020 population is 11,387. **William Li** and **Mandy Brown** are the Senior Management Analysts in the City Manager's office. **Lisa Natusch** is the City Clerk. **Tony Constantouros** served as the <u>Hillsborough</u> City Manager from December 1994 until December 2012.

After working as an Assistant Bank Examiner in 1972 Anthony Constantouros served Contra Costa County as an Administrative Services Assistant (1974-1980). In 1980 Tony went to work as a Personnel Officer for the City of Mountain View (1980-1986). He worked as the Assistant City Manager for the City of <u>Milpitas</u> from October 1986 to November 1994. Tony was hired in December 1994 as the City Manager for the Town of Hillsborough (1994-2012). After leaving the city, Tony served as the General Manager for the Kensington Police Protection and Community Services District (2017-2020). He worked as the Interim General Manager from May 2022 to February 2023. Tony earned a BS in accounting and finance from the University of California, Berkeley and an MBA from the University of San Francisco. He completed other educational programs at Stanford University, USC and Harvard University.

Menlo Park was inscribed on a wooden arch erected over an entrance gate to land owned by Dennis J. Oliver and D.C. McGlynn in 1854. In 1863 the San Francisco and San Jose Railroad began running trains to the area. They named the local station "Menlo Park" for the existing sign. The town grew around the original arch. Menlo Park incorporated in November 1927. The 2020 population is set at 33,780. Menlo Park was home to the late Craig Nealis, who served as a Rolling Hills City Manager. Justin Murphy serves as the City Manager following the 2022 resignation of former City Manager Starla Jerome-Robinson. Judi Herren is the Menlo Park City Clerk. Stephen Stolte is the Assistant City Manager and Nikki Nagaya is the Deputy City Manager. Brittany Mello is the Administrative Services Director.

Menlo Park City Manager Justin Murphy began his public service career as a planning intern. He worked in intern positions in San Jose, Albany and Palo Alto before becoming a Junior Planner for the City of Alameda in 1993. In November 1993, Justin has hired as a Project Planner for the City of San Leandro. Justin joined the Menlo Park city staff the first time in August 1996 as an Associate Planner (1996-1998). He moved up in the department to Senior Planner (1998-2001); Principal Planner (2001-2004); and Development Services Manager (2004-2013). He was appointed Assistant Community Development Director starting in October 2014, and in January 2016 he became the Menlo Park Public Works Director (2016-2019). <u>Millbrae</u> got its start as a rancho in 1827 where grazing and agriculture were established. The Sixteen Mile House, an historic restaurant and rest stop on was built in 1872. After a decade of

heated debate, the city was incorporated in January 1948. The 2020 population is 23,216. The city manager is **Thomas C. Williams** and the City Clerk is **Elaine Tran. Joan Cassman** is the City Attorney. **Mike Sung** is the Director of Finance. **Darcy Smith** is the Community Development Director, **Hannah Moran** is the <u>Millbrae</u> Recreation Services Manage, and **Ron Poppp** is the Director of Public Works.

According to the City's web page, Thomas C. Williams has served as the Millbrae City Manager since December 2018. He previously served as the City Manager for the City of Milpitas (August 2005-September 2017). Tom started his working career with a private sector firm in Walnut Creek in 1998. He was hired as the Assistant Director of Community Development for the Town of Los Gatos in 2002, and he became the Planning & Community Development Director for San Bruno in 2003. Tom went to the City of Milpitas in 2005 as the Planning & Community Services Director. He was elevated to the City Manager position in 2006 and worked in that post until 2017. Tom earned a BA and competed some graduate studies at San Diego State University.

<u>Millbrae</u> Director of Finance **Mike Sung** came to work for the city in June 2020. Previously he served as Deputy Director of Finance for the City of <u>Fremont</u> starting in 2013. <u>Pacifica</u> is the site of the oldest European explorer's discovery of the San Francisco Bay. A hike to Sweeney Ridge on November 4, 1769 revealed the bay, which had been missed by earlier explorers due

to the bay's entrance being shrouded in fog. <u>Pacifica</u> is a well-known surfing destination. The City of <u>Pacifica</u> was incorporated in November 1957. **Kevin Woodhouse** is the City Manager, and **Sarah Coffey** is the City Clerk. **Yulia Carter** is the Assistant City Manager. **Christian Murdock** is the Planning Director, **Lisa Petersen** is the Public Works Director and **Irene Camarena** is the Human Resources Manager.

In April 2006, **Kevin Woodhouse** went to work in the City of <u>Mountain View</u> as the Assistant to the City Manager. He was promoted to Deputy City Manager in September 2010. In July 201 3, Kevin took the position of Assistant General Manager for the Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District. He left the District in October 2017 to accept the appointment to the <u>Pacifica</u> City Manager post. Kevin earned a BA from Stanford University and an MPA from San Francisco State University. He also completed the Executive Leadership Program at the Haas School of Business at the University of California, Berkeley.
