## "Proof of Life" Program Gains Interest Throughout the State

It is healthy to keep in touch with old friends and colleagues. It can be lonely out there without continued personal contact and interaction. A few years back a small number of retired City Manager and friend began meeting for lunch quarterly. The initial luncheon meetings were held in the lounge area of Taps Fish House & Brewery in the City of Brea. Early sessions included retired Pomona City Manager Doug Hawaiian Gardens Dunlap, former Administrator Ray Harris, retired Huntington Park City Manager Gregory Korduner; former Rosemead City Manager and retired El Segundo Assistant City Manager Bill Crow; the late retired Paramount City Manager and CEO of the California JPIA, Bill Holt, and a few others. The group met at Taps for a few years and continued to grow until it was too large for the Brea venue. The next steps were to find another convenient venue and develop a group name.





Trackdown

When friends get together for lunch, one never knows what wild plans may hatch. The actual inception of the "Proof of Life" lunch program resulted from a lunch with a few friends at the Wood Ranch Restaurant in Cerritos. Tap's was chosen as the first venue because it provided enough room for a moderate sized group in its lounge area. Besides retired Pomona City Manager Doug Dunlap knew the people at the restaurant, which helped. The first few lunches at Tap's gathered near 20 folks, and then word of mouth marketing developed a broader interest.

The veteran Tap's attenders are the people who kept the lunches going, and brought success to this effort: the on-going "Proof of Life" lunch program.

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Picking Up the Pieces: Huntington Beach Public Works Director Travis Hopkins is the new Huntington Beach Assistant City Manager, working with City Manager Oliver Chi. Travis joined the city staff in 2006 as an engineer in the Public Works Department, and was

promoted to Public Works Director in 2007. Pomona City Manager Linda Lowry will retire at the end of the year. San Clemente City Manager, a former Azusa City Manager (2012-2014), James Makshanoff has been hired to replace her. Linda's last day will be December 31. Deputy City Manager Mark Gluba will serve as Interim City Manager until James arrives on January 21, 2020. Seal Beach City Manager Jill **Ingram** has earned an employment agreement amendment that will increase her compensation over a two-year period. Jill's last compensation adjustment was January 1, 2017. Jill joined the Seal Beach city staff in 2008 as the Assistant to the City Manager. She became Assistant City Manager in 2011, and she was appointed City Manager in 2011. Jill served as Cypress City Clerk in 2000-2006. City Manager Rod Butler has left his position in Port Hueneme to accept an appointment to the Jurupa Valley City Manager position. Port Hueneme Chief of Police Andrew Salinas will serve as the Interim City Manager. Rod joined the Port Hueneme city staff as City Manager in November, 2016. He previously served as City Manager in Crescent City (2009-2011), Patterson (2011-2014), and Upland (2014-2016). Rod earned an MPA from California State University, Long Beach. He received a 20-year ICMA Service Award in 2018. According to the East Bay Times, at least four Richmond City Managers have come and gone in the last year. City Manager Carlos Martinez was terminated after less than a year, and he was replaced with veteran City Manager Henry Gardner in an "Acting" capacity, after Rochelle Polk, turned down the position. Former Lafayette City Manager Steven Falk replaced Henry as Interim City Manager, after Henry was only weeks in the post. The City of Richmond is in the process of recruiting for a new City Manager. Fairfield Assistant City Manager Laura Snideman is the new Richmond City Manager succeeding the Interim City Manager. She has served as ACM in Fairfield since 2014. Before that she was the Executive Officer of the Napa County LAFCO. Before that she served on the Half Moon Bay city staff starting in 2009. She was the Half Moon Bay City Manager for three years. City of Imperial City Manager Stefan Chatwin is the new City Manager in the City of Fairfield. Stefan went to Imperial in October, 2016. His last day in Imperial is December 27, 2019.



More Pieces Picked Up: Moreno Valley City Manager Tom DeSantis has retired after two-years on the job. Economic Development Director Mike Lee has been appointed Interim City Manager. Tom was appointed City Manager in December, 2017

after City Manager Michelle Dawson left the position. Tom previously served as the Assistant City Manager in Riverside. Fontana City Manager Ken Hunt joined the city staff in 1990 as an auditor and he was promoted to City Manager in 1999. He logged 20years as City Manager and is retiring with two-years remaining on his employment agreement. Veteran retired City Manager Mike Milhiser has been appointed Interim City Manager. Mike has served as City Manager in Montclair, Ontario and Upland. Since retiring he has served in several "Interim" capacities. Mike estimates that he will be in Fontana into February. It's official. Santa Paula approved an employment agreement with their new City Manager Dan Singer. Dan started with Santa Paula as Interim City Manager. He began his career as an Administrative Intern in Lafayette in 1991 before joining the Ojai city staff as Assistant to the City Manager in 1992. He was promoted to Director of General Services in 1998 and became Ojai City Manager in 2001. Dan left Ojai when he was appointed City Manager in Goleta in 2005. He served as Poway City Manager starting in 2014. Dan received a 20-year ICMA Service Award in 2011. Former Milpitas City Manager Julie Edmonds-Mares is now the Chief Operating Officer for a Cincinnatibased consulting firm with offices in San Jose and Orange County. The City continues to retain the firm for consulting services. Julie is a former Deputy City Manager in San Jose. She was hired by Milpitas in early 2018 to replace City Manager Tom Williams, who resigned in September, 2017. Palmdale Assistant City Manager J. J. Murphy is the new Palmdale City Manager with the retirement of City Manager James Purtee. Jim served as City Manager in Palmdale starting in August, 2015. J. J. joined the Palmdale city staff in April, 2018 after 20-years in public service. He was named New Mexico City Manager of the Year in 2016 when he was City Manager in Hobbs, New Mexico. He is a 20-year U. S. Air Force veteran. J. J. earned a BA from King's College and an MPA from Marywood University. Calistoga City Manager Mike Kirn, the City's former Director of Public Works, recently received a satisfactory performance evaluation and compensation increase. According to Administrative Services Director Gloria Leon, the new salary level compares to City Managers in other
